

To the library... and beyond!

You know that your library card lets you borrow items from the Wayne Public Library. You might also know that you can request materials from other libraries to be sent here for you to pick up. But did you know that you can take your Wayne Public Library card on the road with you and use it in-person at many libraries you visit throughout the state?

The Wayne Public Library is a member of The Library Network (TLN) co-op, made up of over 100 local libraries. About 50 libraries in TLN also share a computer system, which means your Wayne library card will work seamlessly at those libraries (such as Romulus, Inkster, Garden City, and Livonia). Other nearby TLN libraries (such as Westland and Canton) have their own computer systems but still offer reciprocal borrowing—you just have to register your Wayne library card with them before checking out materials for the first time.

Recently, the Wayne Public Library joined MILibraryCard, which opens up access to even more libraries across the state! If you'd like to visit and borrow materials from a MILibraryCard library (such as Detroit, Benton Harbor, or even Mackinac Island), just ask us to add a MILibraryCard sticker to your Wayne library card, then register your card when you visit one of these other libraries. 
