- The Michigan Activity Pass (MAP), which allows you to check out passes for free admission to places like the Metroparks or Yankee Air Museum
- Our Seed Library, where you can take seeds to grow at home and bring in seeds you'd like to share
- Home Delivery, for patrons who are temporarily or permanently unable to leave their homes
- Wi-Fi hotspots for checkout
- 1-on-1 computer help by appointment
- Access to online databases that can help with everything from car repairs to SAT prep to genealogy research.

Snow Day Survival Kits



Saturday, Dec. 9 12:30 - 1:30 pm


Bring your friends and family and build a festive "gingerbread house" with graham crackers, icing, and lots of candy!

Thursday, Dec 21 6:30 - 7:30 pm




Create a unique snowflake ornament that you can hang from a window. No previous crocheting experience is necessary!
